## Tenure and Promotion

It is the time of year to gather information for annual merit reviews. Take the opportunity to take this organization one step further. Be sure to scan and archive documents that you will want to use in a tenure or promotion dossier. This is a good idea whether the review is next year or in five years. For those applying for tenure or promotion in the Fall of 2010, now is the time to start planning and preparing your dossier. Outline research activities (short and long term) and gather and organize all your paperwork. Refer to the new 2010 [model dossier](#) for guidance. The process requires that your dossier and most appendices be presented in an electronic format. Scanning and document conversion can be a time consuming endeavor. So, start early, network outside the university, and ask your department committee or chair what and when things are needed.



## International Research Collaborations

Have you taken part in international research collaborations? Would you like to, but are finding barriers in the process of establishing collaborations? ADVANCE is conducting research with faculty who have and you have not had these experiences.
