The [External Career Mentoring Program](#) complements Northeastern's existing internal

mentoring activities to strengthen the national and international networks of faculty. These mentoring teams are designed with colleagues from outside Northeastern who serve as "Northeastern ADVANCE Career Mentors." The teams are designed to enable Northeastern women to break into new networks. The goal is to effectively broaden the professional opportunities of participating faculty and their Northeastern departments. Northeastern ADVANCE will sponsor special events for the broader community when these Career Mentors come to campus. The first mentoring teams were created around the theme of biological, chemical, environmental, and pharmaceutical science and engineering fields and engages women faculty from six departments across three Northeastern colleges.
