The Advancement of Pharmaceutical Care through Education

Harbor Health Services, Inc. (HHSI) acts as the primary practice site for the Pharmacy Practice Residency (PGY-1) with focuses in ambulatory care and/or geriatrics.

All of the clinical pharmacists practicing within the HHSI system have faculty appointments at Northeastern University. Faculty are responsible for providing didactic instruction in their specialty to pharmacy students in years P1-P3. In addition to didactic instruction, faculty members precept P4 students completing their Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPEs).



Other opportunities in education are offered by clinical pharmacists to HHSI staff and community members in order to illustrate the benefits of integrated services and collaborative medication therapy management.

HHSI pharmacists provide both clinical and dispensing services in the community health centers (CHCs) affiliated with HHSI.
