What do you need to know about H-1B visas, the most common type of visas for Northeastern graduates working in the US? If you are now on an F-1 visa, planning to find a US job, use your OPT and hopefully be sponsored for an H-1B after that, come learn from immigration attorney Monique Kornfeld about this process. You are welcome to come if you are on another kind of visa, but this workshop will focus on the F-1 student and you will need to consult with ISSI to discover the specific rules for other visa types.
