Recommendation for Reduced Course Load

The minimum full-time course load for international students is 12 credits (undergraduate), 9 credits (graduate) or 6 credits (graduate - SGA). A Reduced Course Load may only be approved in advance, once during each program level, and only for the reasons given below. A medical reduced course load or leave of absence may not exceed 12 months in total. Part I must be completed by the international student. Part II must be completed by a representative of the College/Graduate School/ Dean's office.

COMPLETE THIS FORM IF:

1. You need to drop a course or courses due to academic difficulties. The only approved reasons for dropping a course are a) improper course placement, b) unfamiliarity with American Teaching Methods, or c) initial difficulty with English Language or reading requirements. The second two reasons are common for new students. The first reason applies when you register for a course and then you and/or the teacher discover that you should not be taking the class because you need a higher or lower level (in the case of a language or math course for example). Sometimes you enroll and then discover the course is above or below your level of comprehension. Or you need a prerequisite. The key to qualifying for improper course placement is that you discuss it with the professor and find yourself in a position where it is too late in the quarter or semester to add another class. Remember, immigration requires you to be full-time even if courses you need are not available. The only exception is during your last term. See #2:
2. You are completing your final requirements for your program of study. During the last term, the Designated School Official from the ISSI can give you permission for a reduced course load if you will complete all degree requirements that term.
3. You need to reduce your course load or be out of school entirely for medical reasons. You must have a letter from a licensed physician, clinical psychologist or doctor of osteopathy and follow the procedures outlined for obtaining a medical leave of absence.

GENERAL DEFINITIONS

Completion date – date when you complete(d) your program of study. This may be the date of your graduation or the actual date of completion of your program. For example, if you are finishing at a time when there is no formal graduation ceremony such as December or March

Designated college/graduate school official – the academic administrative official in your college or graduate school

Designated School Official (DSO) - Staff member of the International Student & Scholar Institute, approved by immigration to issue documents and approve certain events in SEVIS

SEVIS - Student Exchange Visitor Information System run by various bureaus of the Department of Homeland Security
