In order to deliver the best possible orientation, the International Student & Scholar Institute (ISSI) needs to fully prepare Leaders. Thus, becoming an ISSI Orientation Leader is a commitment to participate in the training session to be held in early December, and to be active in the ISSI Orientation program. **Leaders are expected to adhere fully to their scheduled commitments after they have been agreed upon.** Any changes should be requested in advance from ISSI staff. It is the policy of the ISSI to remain neutral in all religious and political issues in order to be more effective and receptive to the wide variety of people who participate in the program. It is likewise necessary for Leaders to adhere to these policies and to remain as impartial as possible in imposing or promoting their own personal view while representing the ISSI.

The ISSI Orientation program will begin during the first full week of January and will extend through the end of January. Intensive involvement occurs primarily during the first week of the program; however, participation on the part of the Leaders is expected throughout the entire program. Once classes begin, most activities are held during evenings and weekends.
