When considering a student(s) for candidacy, we encourage nominators to reflect on the following criteria:

- What service programs, projects or organizations has the nominee participated in? List projects, programs, organizations, awards and include dates.
- Has the nominee created any community service based projects, programs, or organizations while at school? List projects, programs, organizations and include dates.
- Does the nominee exemplify leadership skills that surpass other leaders/peers?
- How has the nominee represented themselves to their academic community as well as those in their neighborhood?
- How has the nominee impacted their communities?
- To what extent has the nominee improved the quality of life of others locally/globally?
- How has this nominee's personal character made him or her especially qualified for this award?
