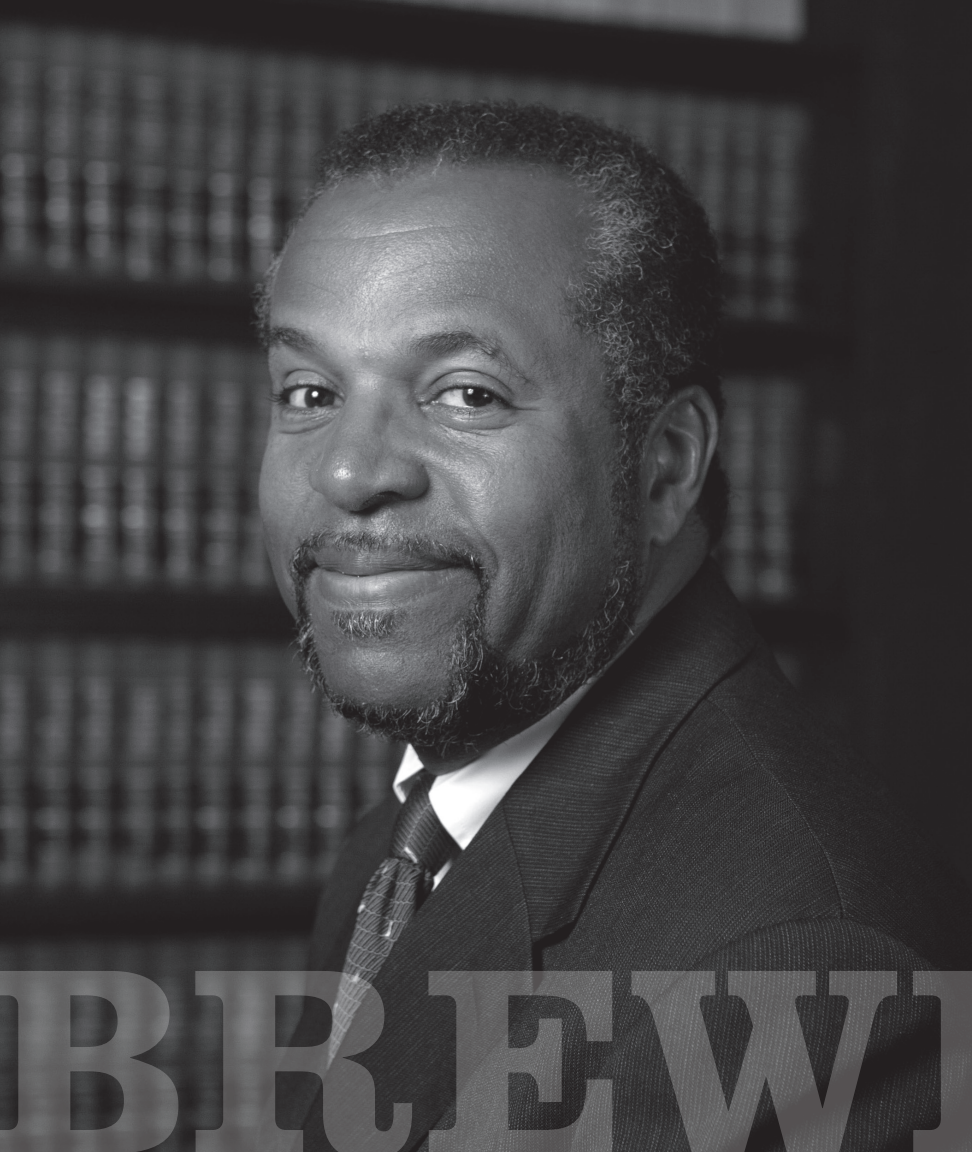

Fred Brewington is a renowned civil rights lawyer and community advocate. After working at a number of prestigious law firms and offices, including a clerkship in the Office of the Legal Counsel of the United States Senate, Mr. Brewington began a private practice now based in Long Island. With his expertise in civil rights litigation, Mr. Brewington has successfully challenged the ‘at large’ voting system in the Town of Hempstead, New York, and has worked to prevent future unconstitutional and discriminatory purging of voters from the voting roll.

work includes service to many community groups and organizations. Last year, the governor of New York appointed Mr. Brewington to the state Judicial Screening Committee that recommended a new chief judge for the Court of Appeals, the state’s highest court; Mr. Brewington now sits on the selection committees for the Court of Claims and Family Court. He is also a certified lay speaker in the United Methodist Church, and serves on several boards and committees in the church, including the General Board of Church and Society in Washington, DC.
