Standard Drinks in a Solo Cup

A standard drink is the amount of alcohol that your body can safely process in one hour. When drinking from solo cups, it can be very easy to lose track of how much you are consuming. Below are the measurements within a solo cup for different types of alcohol.



- 12 oz. beer
- 8-10 oz. malt liquor (Smirnoff Ice, Colt 45, etc.)
- 4-5 oz. wine or champagne (2nd from bottom line)
- 1-1.5 oz. liquor (bottom line)

Northeastern Medical Amnesty Policy Why Does NU have a Medical Amnesty Policy?

The primary concern of the University is students' health and safety. The Medical Amnesty Policy was developed so that students would not be deterred from seeking help in alcohol and/or drug related emergencies due to concern regarding disciplinary action.

How Does the Medical Amnesty Policy Work?

If someone is under the influence of alcohol or drugs and you're concerned for his/her safety, call NUPD at 617-373-3333. As long as you are *proactive* in seeking help and you *stay with the person until help arrives*, both caller and the intoxicated person will be eligible for Medical Amnesty.

What Happens if You're Granted Medical Amnesty?

If you're granted Medical Amnesty, the intoxicated person and the caller will not be held responsible for violating policies on possession or consumption of alcohol or drugs.

Do You Have to Meet With Anyone if You're Granted Medical Amnesty?

Most of the time if someone is granted Medical Amnesty, the intoxicated person will be referred to OPEN for an individual check-in.
