

Application to the Learning Disabilities Program at Northeastern University

The Learning Disabilities Program (LDP) offers placement to a limited number of students. To initiate the admissions process, the student must complete the application process for the University through the Admissions Office. In addition, students should submit the LDP application to the director of the program, Mary Barrows.

Application to the Learning Disabilities Program includes:

1. Completed application to the LDP (attached)

The application should be filled out by the student. It may be typed or handwritten.

2. LDP Accommodation Request form (attached)
3. High school transcript (and college transcript, if you are transferring)
4. SAT or ACT scores (official copy *not* required)
5. Documentation of learning disability or attention deficit disorder

In addition, we require an interview with LDP staff. Once you have been accepted to the University, please call the LDP to schedule an interview. Students who are accepted into the LDP are informed personally by the program director.

Guidelines for the documentation of learning disabilities and attention deficit disorder

Documentation of a learning disability and/or attention deficit disorder generally consists of the student's most recent psychoeducational or neuropsychological evaluation. It may also include the student's IEP or 504 plan from high school.

Students who are arranging their first neuropsychological evaluation or who are having a thorough re-evaluation may want to reference the additional guidelines for obtaining appropriate documentation, available at: www.northeastern.edu/uhs/ldp. Click on "Documentation and Accommodations."

The most thorough and useful reports include a *specific diagnosis*, a *list of the tests* administered, *scores*, a *narrative providing an interpretation* of the scores, and *recommendations* for accommodations and instructional and study strategies. Based on the student's presenting difficulties, the report will address the following areas:

- general intellectual functioning
- academic functioning
- calculation and arithmetic problem-solving
- language (receptive, expressive, listening, reading, writing)
- attention
- perception
- motor
- spatial and constructional
- memory (encoding, verbal vs. nonverbal material, retrieval)
- processing speed
- organization (goal-setting, planning, sequencing, inhibition, self-monitoring)
- emotional factors (expression, sensitivity, anxiety, depression)
