

Guevera Noubir, associate professor of computer science, talked with Quad Cities (Ill.) Online for a July 20 story about fake wireless networks stealing consumer information. "With enough education and media coverage, people will see that this is a big issue," he said.

Jeff O'Brien, director of Mentors in Violence Prevention at the Center for the Study of Sport in Society, spoke with the Press-Enterprise of Southern California for a July 12 story on two women buying a WNBA team. "Obviously this is a step in the right direction, and personally I think it's great," he said. "But from a sociological perspective, thinking big picture and power structure, there's still a glass ceiling."

Kwamina Panford, associate professor and associate vice provost, spoke with U.S. News & World Report for an Aug. 5 story about the 40th anniversary of Ghana's independence. "Ghana reminds me of America," he said. "Ghanaians feel that the sky is the limit."

Harlan Platt, professor of finance, was quoted in an Aug. 8 story by Human Resource Executive Online about a union report on private-equity firms buying up companies. Sometimes in those buyouts, "they begin to treat people like nothing more than assets," Platt said. "They're forgetting the most important asset a company has are its people and you cannot treat them that way for long or else they'll leave."

John Portz, professor and chair of political science, was interviewed by the Metrowest Daily News for an Aug. 7 story about a Massachusetts congressional race in which three candidates do not live in the district. "I think, in our country, it would be unusual," he said. "It's interesting, though, that the constitution says that a person only needs to be in the state to run."

Peter Roby, director of athletics, talked with USA Today for a July 24 story about San Franciscans embracing Barry Bonds. "People want to root for something that represents San Francisco and in a lot of ways is going to end up creating a historical legacy that will never be broken," he said.

Emmett Price, assistant professor of music, talked with The Boston Globe for an Aug. 5 story on pop singer Beyoncé. "In pop culture, we've had a disdain for those people who have reached that kind of level of celebrityhood and worldwide acceptance," he said.

Wendy Seltzer, visiting professor of law, talked with The Boston Globe for an Aug. 4 story about the National Football League restricting media use of audio and video of team personnel. "The public benefits from a richer stream of information," she said. "Maybe we, as a public, should demand greater access."

Jason Smith, associate executive director of the Public Health Advocacy Institute, spoke with Adweek for an Aug. 6 story on fast-food advertising. "Companies need to change the marketing environment or the courts are going to have to revisit commercial law doctrines," he said.

Emily Spieler, dean of law, spoke with Lawjobs.com about new law graduates looking for work. "They do not have an accurate perception of the job market," she said. "They have very restricted views."

Andrew Sum, director of the Center for Labor Market Studies, spoke to the New Jersey Star-Ledger for a July 18 story about teen summer unemployment. "You learn how to work by working," he said. "We will all pay a price for this."

John Swain, associate professor of physics, spoke with The Boston Globe for a July 8 story about using bicycles to move heavy objects. "It's like pushing a car that's in neutral," he said. "If the road is flat, you're OK, but if it's got a slight downstep, then the car might get away from you."

Bruce Wallin, associate professor of political science, appeared on Boston's Neighborhood Network News on July 23 to discuss the financial pressures cities are facing. "Boston needs to diversify its revenue sources in order to meet the service needs of its residents," he said.

Eli Wolff, project director of the Center for the Study of Sport in Society, spoke with the Houston Chronicle for a July 10 story about college scholarships for wheelchair athletes. "The NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) is just now beginning to set more policy and develop more disabled-sports opportunities at the college level," he said.
