

Frequently Asked Questions

N Northeastern University Housing and Residential Life

1. Can I choose my residence hall?

Students provide their preferences for housing type (apartment style, suite style, traditional corridor style), not specific residence halls. Last year's *NUin* cohort were placed into 39 different residence halls.

2. When is move-in?

Move-in will be Wednesday, January 6, 2021. Your specific move-in time will be provided to you during the fall semester once you receive your housing assignment.

3. When will I know my housing assignment?

Most *NUin* students will get their assignments in mid to late December.

4. What if I don't get along with my roommate?

We encourage residents to openly communicate with their roommate. Residential Life provides roommate agreement templates to help facilitate this communication between roommates. While we hope all students have a compatible roommate experience, we do offer an Open Room Change period each semester for students wishing to explore other room options. Residential Life staff will guide you through the process.

5. What should I bring when I move-in?

Bring the things you will need, but leave the prohibited items at home! Specific items are listed on our website and the Guide to Residence Hall Living. You'll also want to communicate with your roommate beforehand so you don't end up with extra things!



Housing by the Numbers

- Last year's NUin cohort were placed into 39 different residence halls.
- Over 85% of NUin students were placed into their top housing style choice or with a requested roommate.
- 54% of NUin students were placed in apartment style housing, 29% in semi-private suites, and 17% in traditional first-year halls.
- Of those placed in apartment style housing, 39% were in Standard or Economy rate buildings, and 61% were in Enhanced rate buildings.
- Resident Assistant to student ratio is 1:40 across campus.

We will review all housing applications in enrollment deposit date order and do our best to accommodate all requests based on availability.

Living in University Housing

- Traditional first and second-year students are required to live in university housing.
- NUin students will complete the online housing application during October and November.
- Roommate requests are permitted through the housing application process.
- All Gender Housing is offered to students of every class year and can be requested in the online housing application.
- **Students who require certain housing accommodations for a medical reason should register with the Disability Resource Center at Northeastern as well as at your NUin site.**
